Many who eat at the Kitchen report this is their most **substantial** meal of the day.





Our **Social enterprise**, Bistro on Main, is a popular local restaurant which provides **transitional** employment and training to Chefs and wait staff. The MACCchefs program is designed to help train those ready to move forward with a career in hospitality and food services.



It features an intensive 18-week curriculum focused on culinary foundations and core competencies needed in the professional kitchen. Our program is centered on assisting low-income wage earners, those at-risk of homelessness or already homeless.
