Message from our Executive Director

2021-2022 was an odd year to figure out. It appeared more "new" people sought help, while many of whom we see often were no-shows for their appointments. 
The **Community Kitchen** is open for lunch six days a week, Monday through Saturday, from 11:30 AM to 12:45 PM. With our pick-up to-go service, we were able to re-introduce hot meals three days a week. Due to no inside dining, we provided outside picnic tables for our guests to sit, enjoy fellowship, and a well-balanced meal. The kitchen served just over 2000 more meals this fiscal year than before, an increase of 6%.


Sources of Income 2022

If this last year has taught us anything, it is that we cannot predict what will come over these next few years economically. With the recent decline in spending and the increase in rates across the board, we have introduced market uncertainty to predict what's to come. Other than an increase in need.

Community Outreach & Emergency Services

continues to see a steady increase in clients seeking Emergency assistance. We continue to work within our scope to meet the growing demands of continued economic challenges. Our strong and continued development of partnerships with various Federal, State, and Local agencies play a significant role in reaching, identifying, and servicing our most vulnerable community members.

Outreach responded to over 100 reported homeless episodes of non-duplicated individuals throughout the fiscal year. Emergency Services fielded over 1800 calls for assistance.

MACC managed and operated a Cold Weather Shelter Pilot Program for the 2021-2022 winter season consisting of 14 motel rooms that 30 different individuals utilized.
