What a successful first year of our MACC Coffee Corner!


We had 17 different groups join us for a tour of our campus and discuss how they can best support MACC.

2,063

people were served by the Community Outreach & Emergency Services team this year

The **Community Kitchen** is open for lunch six days a week, Monday through Saturday, from 11:30 AM to 12:45 PM. With our pick-up to-go service, we continue to serve hot meals three days a week. With no inside dining, we provided outside picnic tables for our guests to sit, enjoy fellowship, and a well-balanced meal. The Community Kitchen served the community just over 6000 more meals this fiscal year than before, an increase of 28%, and the Senior Center served 2000 more meals, an increase of 12%.

Community Emergency Food Pantry

The Community Emergency Food Pantry continues working with families in need in our community. Our volunteers have continued shopping for our families and their basic needs by appointment.



We continue to work with our local partners, member churches, local farms, food drives from local civic groups, and our annual events, including the Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive and Emergency of Hunger Food Drive. MACC remains dedicated to helping the residents of Manchester and Bolton with food insecurity.

Community Outreach & Emergency Services

The 2022-2023 Fiscal Year presented significant increases in both our Homeless Outreach and Emergency Services. We received 213 unsheltered referrals during the 12-month period ending 6/30/23, representing a 52% increase year over year in Outreach Services.

Emergency Services fielded in excess of 2300 calls/emails, representing a 30% increase year over year.

We continue to adapt and strengthen our programs to meet the growing demands and economic challenges that face our community. Our continued development of partnerships with Federal, State, and Local agencies, as well as community-based organizations, businesses, and citizens, plays a significant role in reaching our most vulnerable community members and target population.

MACC's COES Manager, along with support from all our MACC departments, will again operate a Cold Weather Shelter Program for the 2023-2024 season, focusing on vulnerable, unhoused Manchester residents.
